THE MEETING OF THE BANDS

The Meeting of the Bands, by Sheila Murphy



THE BANDS

Those familiar with the Shannon Rovers have likely heard or read how our premier pipe band began in 1926 as a fife and drum band comprised of five men, led by Tommie Ryan. What most people do not know is the legacy of some of our members.

In 1932, as the Shannon Rovers were putting down their fifes and picking up the bagpipes, Tommie Ryan was recruiting men and women to form the Shannon Rovers Irish Pipe Band. Through the years, several members hailed from Arranmore Island, Donegal. Having played for the Arranmore Pipe Band, the O'Hara's, O'Donnell's, and Boyle's were well-equipped to share their talents in Chicago.

Boyles joined The the Shannon Rovers in 1952 the Chicago when Pipe Shamrock Band disbanded. Bagpipers and brothers Phil, John, and Patrick were the uncles of member current band Danny Boyle. The Shannon Rovers quickly became a family affair for the Boyles, as Danny and his brother Phil joined the band in the Danny 1960's. married bagpiper Noreen Loftus, and both Danny and Phil were able to proudly march alongside their children as they, too, joined the band.

In the 1990s. at the encouragement of Danny's mother, Danny's then eightcousin, year-old Murphy, took up the bagpipes and became a Rover. Kevin later returned the favor by encouraging his sister, Sheila, to become a snare drummer. As the Arranmore legacy lives on in the Shannon Rovers, so does the Arranmore Pipe Band. This September, the Arranmore Pipe Band made a historic trip to the United follow in States to their ancestors' footsteps to Beaver Island, Michigan, and Chicago.



For nearly 15 years, the Arranmore Pipe Band was led by Pipe Major Alec Brown. Alec, originally from Fife, Scotland, was a phenomenal piper who served as Pipe Major to the Black Watch Pipes and Drums before retiring on Arranmore Island. Alec dreamed of bringing the Arranmore Pipe Band to play in Beaver Island and Chicago. After working tirelessly to plan the trip for over a year, Alec, passed away unexpectedly in July. Generously, Alec's brother Tam, agreed to travel from Scotland to finish preparing the Arranmore Pipe Band their and lead them on journey to the States.

With great pleasure and powerful sound, the Arranmore Pipe Band and the Shannon Rovers Irish Pipe Band came together to bring the music of our forefathers to a welcoming crowd of over 200 at the Irish American Heritage Center in September. Following the performance, members of the both bands had opportunity to meet and learn from each other. It was truly an honor to be a part of this historical event, where two great bands with ties that date back to 1926, were able to share in their music and history.

March 17th, 115 Bourbon Street with WGN News. St Patrick's Day Extravaganza. Start time 6:45 am.

On a cold, dark Friday morning, we packed up the car and headed down to the 115 Bourbon Street, Merrionette Park. It was an early morning Band job. When we arrived, our first surprise was the size of Bourbon Street. The place is massive! We get inside and we start wondering around, looking for other Rovers. Every room was packed but no Rovers to be found. We started asking the workers there and they point us to the back room. The bagpipers are "back there" they say. Well, there are bagpipers alright, but it's another group. How many "back rooms" does Bourbon Street have? Finally, the Rovers start coming into the back room from the other halls. The Pipers do a tune up to ensure a tight performance for our friends at WGN and their TV audience. The Drummers, who are always ready to go, wait for them to finish. It turns out they want us to play a couple of times during the broadcast. Once during a new skit with the other pipe band for a Bean Bag Toss Game – except this was with bass drum mallets. Then, they had us line up and march into the Main Room where the newscasters were broadcasting on the Main Stage. While we were waiting to play, I get a text message from Emmett. He and Ryan got a selfie with Larry Potash, as he was walking thru the rooms. The little stinkers! How did they beat me? I didn't get a chance to meet Larry, but I did say hello to Paul Konrad when he was talking to us and a quick hello to Mike Toomey as he walked by. The most amazing part of that job, was how well it was organized. They would do the daily news stories, then a break to the Shannon Rovers playing, then a School Choir, then Irish Dancers, the Jessie White Tumblers. It was nonstop. They had entertainment going on in each room. It looks great on TV, but to see how they put it all together, amid the St Patrick's Day celebration was simply amazing. You can really see and

appreciate all the hard work that goes into putting that Show together. Plus, I have to hand it to the South Siders, when they say they've been celebrating all day ...they mean it. We had a great time and look forward to playing there again.

WGN News is there reporting the event and checking in the anchors back at the WGN Studio. We play a few more times. Everyone is handed out a pair of giant Harry Caray type glasses including Cubs HOF Ryne Sandberg, Sox great Ron Kittle and Ryan Dempster as well as several Band Members who donned them during the gig in Harry's honor. During one of the breaks, we got a chance to chat with Ana Belaval and Pat Tomasulu - two of WGN News finest. Emmett and Ryan were standing right behind them during a news segment, so they got a lot of air time. We also got a picture with them at the end of the job. Another great Rover memory in the books. When you're with the Shannon Rovers, you end up playing in different and unusual places. You never know who you will meet and what you will be doing during the day, but it is always a great time. Were happy to bring our sons with, because they enjoy the experiences as much as we do. And naturally, we hope our music brings you joy and fond memories as well.

Roving in the Big Easy

While the we pride ourselves in spreading the way of the Gael in and around the Chicagoland area, every once in a while, the Shannon Rovers get the travel itch. There comes a time when we like taking our show on the road to celebrate with the great people of this country. Past trips have included marching in Savannah and Boston St. Patrick's Day parades, playing at the White House in Washington DC, entertaining lowans at the John Wayne Museum, and playing on the Auld Sod in Dublin, Ireland or down under in Australia. Since the pandemic, the Rovers had been confined to playing locally, but about a year ago. murmurs of another Rover Road Trip began in earnest. But where should we take our talents?

One night, over a pint or three, Tom Finnegan and Pat Van De Walle came up with what seemed like a natural fit: the Shannon Rovers should go New Orleans and play at Mardi Gras. Using his connections from his days attending Loyola University-New Orleans, Tom was put in touch with the chief organizer for Mardi Gras parades and his offer was met with great enthusiasm. "Yes! We would love to have the legendary Shannon Rovers from Chicago march in one of our parades!" In no time at all, we were booked in one of the biggest parades of the season - the Krewe of Endymion – on the Saturday before Fat Tuesday. A plan was hatched, and on February 17th, the Rovers headed to the Bayou. Once travel arrangements were secured and a hotel was booked. Tom and Pat worked on the agenda

















. While marching in a major Krewe parade would be the tentpole event, we knew the Rovers were capable of spreading the joy to other areas of the Big Easy. After all, why spend one night in New Orleans when you can spend three? After speaking with his close friends John and Melissa Cruse. Pat set up a Friday night "Welcome Party" for all Rovers and guests at their home in neighboring Metairie. It was a chance for Chicago to meet and mingle with New Orleans - and the southern hospitality was on display as soon as we walked through the back gates of the Cruse home. We were greeted by friends and neighbors who had brought over traditional NOLA fare like gumbo, jambalaya, red beans and rice, and fried shrimp. In the Pavilion – their garage that has been transformed into a speakeasy worthy of being on Bourbon Street - the Rovers ate. drank, and performed for the neighborhood well into the evening.

After new friendships were formed and cocktails were polished off, we headed back to the French Quarter

. Saturday morning arrived, and we gathered in the lobby uniformed in our special Mardi Gras gear provided (once again) by our great friend, donor, and Color Guard member Pat Leyden. We then boarded busses to the Endymion parade starting point in Mid City. While the Rovers have marched in many a long parade before, even we were surprised at just how long a route – over 5 miles - and how long of a day - over 8 hours - this endeavor would take. Equally as surprising were the size of the crowds from start to finish, some having set up their spots along the route up to two days beforehand. The largess of the floats in the parade was breathtaking and the seemingly endless amounts of beads, cups. and other doubloons thrown to parade goers was unbelievable. This included our custom made Shannon Rover beads (once again courtesy of our generous donors!) It was only a few strides in when we realized that this was not just a parade, but a full-on revival! Playing our best and armed with a few tunes prepared especially for the occasion, we marched on, careful to avoid the plastic frisbees at our feet and kicking strands of beads to th!e side.

Each year we recognize one of our own for their contributions to the band and the Irish community.
